




Race Venues


Finish Area/Spectator Information:


- Alpine GS/SL/Dual SL and Snowboard GS/SL The finish area is only accessible by hiking if you have not purchased a lift ticket.
 Spectator lift tickets (lift ride up only; you must hike down) are available for \$12/day.
- Spectator lift tickets for skiers and snowboarders are \$65/day and can be purchased at the Whiteface lift ticket offices.
- Snowboard/Freeski Rail Jam This finish area is at the base area and is accessible for all spectators
- Snowboard/Freeski Slopestyle This finish area is a short hike from the base area
- Snowboard/Freeski Boarder-Cross/Skier-Cross This finish area is at the base area and is accessible for all spectators

Opening Ceremonies

The Opening Ceremonies for Athletes will be held on Monday, March 7 at Mt. Van Hoevenberg at 6:30pm. Athlete admission and dinner is included with event credentials.

Parents are welcome to attend for a cost of \$20/person. Tickets can be purchased at check-in on Sunday, March 5, from 2pm to 5pm or on Monday, March 6, from 8am to 3pm. Check-in is located in the Lussi Ballroom in the Conference Center.

Awards

The Daily Awards Ceremonies will take place <u>outdoors</u> at Mirror Lake Beach on Tuesday through Friday. The Daily Awards Ceremony on Saturday, March 12 will be at the Jumping Complex. Start time is 4:30pm. Tickets are not required.

The Final Awards Reception will be Saturday, March 12 at the Olympic Jumping Complex at 6:00pm. This event will be outdoors. Athlete admission and dinner is included with event credentials. Parents and spectators may attend free of charge; non-athlete tickets for dinner are \$20/person. Tickets may be purchased at the USCSA Administration Table at Whiteface.

Spectator Lift Rates and Parking Info

We are excited to have here and encourage you to come out the finish lines! Enjoy the live broadcast and make some noise for these unbelievable athletes!

LIFT TICKETS

You can walk to all finish areas; there is no spectator lift ticket needed. If you would like to ride a lift, you will need a lift ticket. If you are the parent of an athlete, you can purchase a discounted spectator lift ticket for \$60/day if you are on skis/snowboard, or \$12/day to ride up the lift to the finish area (Alpine GS/SL/Dual SL and Snowboard GS/SL events; you must hike down).

Consider volunteering at the event in exchange for a future lift ticket! (see "How to Volunteer" section).

No Nordic ticket is required to observe the Nordic events.


